<b>Autumn 2</b>	Geometry and shape – learning to identify and sort shapes using their mathematical names.
<b>Spring 1</b>	Number, place value, addition and subtraction to 50. This will include multiples of 2, 5 and 10.
<b>Spring 2</b>	Investigations of measure including length, height, mass and volume.
<b>Summer 1</b>	Multiplication and division, up to 100. An introduction to fractions using practical resources.
<b>Summer 2</b>	Investigations of measure in everyday life, focusing on time and money.
